


5: Humfrey & Elisabeth Wade to Richard & Uritha Millis: messuage, garden and orchard in Cheam 9.1.1550



West Cheam: Court of the most excellent prince Edward VI by grace of God king of England, France and Ireland, defender of the faith and on earth supreme head of the English and Irish church, held there 9 January 3 Ed VI [1550].

It is enrolled thus: At this court come Humfrey Wade gent and Elisabeth his wife, the same Elisabeth being separately examined by the steward, and surrender into the lord's hand one messuage, one garden and one orchard with appurtenances now in the tenure of Robert Bedyll to the use of Richard Millis gent and Uritha his wife and the heirs of the same Richard, whereby there falls to the lord nothing for heriot because they remain tenants etc. And upon this, at the same court, come the aforesaid Richard Millis and Uritha and seek their admittance to the premises, to whom the lord king by his steward grants them seisin thereof, to have to themselves and the heirs of the same Richard, according to the customs of the manor. And they give for fine for having entry therein 4 shillings, and they do fealty and ^{witt} are admitted tenants thereof, etc.
