

Quitclaim of Napulton tenement in Betchingley to John & Margaret Pleystowe

Know all by these presents that we, John Burstowe junior of Horley in the county of Surrey and Thomas Gylmyn of Burstowe in the aforesaid county, remit, release and entirely quitclaim for ourselves and our heirs forever to John Pleystowe junior and Margaret his wife, daughter of Richard Best senior, their heirs and assigns, all our right, estate, possession and claim that we ever had, have or in whatever manner in future might have, of and in one tenement with its pertinents late Thomas Tunbrugge called Napulton lying in the parish of Betchingley in the aforesaid county, on condition that neither we the aforementioned John Burstowe and Thomas Gilmyn, nor our heirs nor any other in our name henceforth shall be able in future to demand, claim or lay claim to any right, estate, possession or claim in the aforesaid tenement with its pertinents, nor in any parcel thereof, but from all action, right, estate, possession or claim in respect thereof demanded ... shall be excluded forever by these presents. In witness whereof we have appended our seals to the present writing. Dated at Betchingley aforesaid 7 July 3 Edward IV [1463].

A relese made by John Burstowe and Thomas Gelmen unto John Plestowe the j[unior] and Margaret his wyfe a serthen tenement called Napulton lyng in Betchingley.
